

Water Conservation Grant Fund

What is the Water Conservation Grant Fund (WCGF)?

In 2022, the Arizona Legislature created the Water Conservation Grant Fund to help facilitate conservation projects across the state. As part of a larger investment in Arizona's water supplies, this fund is targeted to make sure that water across the state is used effectively, efficiently, and sustainably.

To that end, the Legislature appropriated \$200 million dollars to be awarded as grants to government entities, like counties, cities, towns, irrigation districts, natural resources conservation districts, and NGOs who partner with one of those entities, to enact a wide variety of water-saving projects in all corners of the state.

What kinds of projects are eligible for funding from the WCGF?

There is a wide range of projects that may be eligible for funding from the WCGF. Examples of projects could include, but certainly aren't limited to:

- Water use education and conservation research
- Community incentives for rainwater harvesting
- Widespread installation of drought-resistant landscaping and turf removal incentives
- Infrastructure efficiency upgrades
- Groundwater recharge and retention dams
- Construction of groundwater storage facilities
- Community education initiatives about wise water use

Why should I apply for funding through the WCGF?

Depending on the program or project, applicants could receive up to \$3 million in grant funding for a water conservation initiative with only a 25% match requirement.

What is the process and timeline?

WIFA anticipates being able to accept applications for WCGF grants beginning Spring of 2023. The <u>Water Conservation Grant Committee</u> (Committee) will meet every other month to review applications. The Committee will then make recommendations to the <u>WIFA Board</u> for final approval.
